Our History

Virginia Water Football Club was formed during the 1919-1920 season, celebrating its centenary in 2020. During the reign of King Edward VIII, the club received financial support from the Crown, amounting to £2 per annum. This support continued through the reign of King George VI, who gifted VWFC their current ground. Until 1964, the team participated in the Woking & District League before joining the Surrey Intermediate League, followed by a move to the Spartan League soon after.

In 1969, the clubhouse at the Timbers was erected and opened by Sir Stanley Rouse, CBE, then President of FIFA. The Timbers was named in memory of Harry Timbers, one of the club's founders. In 1970, the club was promoted from the Spartan League to the Combined Counties League and subsequently qualified for the FA Vase. The 1980s were challenging, leading to successive relegations to the Surrey South-Eastern Combination Intermediate League. However, in the 1990/91 season, Waters won the Surrey Intermediate Cup and earned promotion to the Surrey Premier League and Combined Counties League but stayed there for only one season due to league ground grading rulings.

Waters won three Surrey County Premier Cups in 1995, 1996, and 1997, with the latter being part of a League and League Cup Treble. Following league name changes, the club joined the Surrey Senior League in 2000 and stayed until 2002. After a period in the Surrey Intermediate League (Western), the club faced another relegation and immediate promotion. In 2010, Waters was promoted to the Surrey Elite League but despite winning the County and League Cups, further promotion remained out of reach.

Ceri Jones was appointed manager for the 2015-16 season, finishing fourth in his first year. The following season, Richard Banks was appointed Head Coach and successfully led back-to-back promotions to the Hellenic League Division One and then Premier, including a cup double in 2016-17. After consolidating in the Hellenic Premier Division, the club moved to the Combined Counties Premier League (North) due to a National League System adjustment.

At the end of the 2021-22 season, Ceri Jones became Director of Football, appointing Adam Bessent as his successor. The 2022/23 season saw the club reach the Senior County Cup final and achieve its highest-ever league position of 7th place. The Bessent's resigned early in the 2023/24 season and Adam Sams was promoted to First Team manager, assisted by Ben Warren, leading the club to another 7th place league finish and the Combined Counties Premier League Cup Final, where they finished as runners-up.

For the 2024/25 season, the First Team entered a ground share arrangement to play their home games at Slough Town's excellent facilities, achieving a 9th place finish in the league and reaching the First Qualifying Round of the FA Cup, where they were defeated by Isthmian Premier Division Champions, Horsham FC.

The club is striving for success both on and off the field and are currently seeking planning approval for a new ground development back in Virginia Water. Meanwhile our rapidly growing Youth Section will have 27 teams (20 boys and 7 girls) with over 300 players next year and on Saturdays we will be offering three joiner classes: Wildcats (girls), Squads (teenage girls), and Football Fanatics (boys), enabling a further 50 players to start their football pathway with the Club.



Hilltop Football Club | History of the Club



Hilltop Football club is based in Stonebridge and was founded in 2005. They are currently members of the Combined Counties League Premier Division and groundshare with Hillingdon Borough at the Middlesex Stadium. The club was named after a road in Stonebridge called Hilltop Avenue, where most of the players lived at the time when the club was formed.

In 2007, they joined Division Three of the Middlesex County League and gained promotion to the second division at the first attempt. Then, after just two seasons playing in Division Two, the club left the

league. Hilltop eventually re-joined the Middlesex County League Division Two in the 2014/15 season, and the following season were relegated to Division Three having finished bottom of the league. However, the club's management was reformed at this point in their brief history, and success followed. After finishing second in the league, the club was promoted back to Division Two and has since enjoyed a series of triumphs. They won the league at the first attempt and, with it, earned promotion to the Middlesex County Leagues Division One.

The 2018/19 season was another turning point for the club. At the first attempt, Hilltop won the league without losing any games and only conceded 13 goals over the whole season. They also won the Middlesex County Junior Cup, defeating Western Athletic 6-1 in the final, but were denied a treble as they lost the final of the Jim Rodgers Presidents Cup to Clapton CFC. After the reconstruction of the non-league football pyramid, Hilltop were promoted to the Combined Counties Football League Division One on the back of winning the 2019/20 Middlesex County League Premier Division on points-per-game after a season that was ended early due to the Covid-19 pandemic.

In their first season as semi-professional club, Hilltop surprised many with their style of football and managed to finish 2nd in the Combined Counties Football League Division One and losing the playoff final, missing out on promotion to Combined Counties Premier Division. However the club was promoted to the Combined Counties Premier Division, having been offered the vacancy left by

Staines Town. This makes it back-to-back promotions for Hilltop, who continue to go from strength to strength. As the first team has risen through the leagues, the wider club has developed too.

In the 2021/22 season, they launched a reserve team who competed in Division One of the Middlesex County League, as well as a women's team who compete in the Greater London Women's Football League, not to mention a number of youth teams. Last season the first team finished 13th in their first season as a step 5 club, Reserves won the Middlesex County Division 1 League and gained promotion to the Premier Division. The Women's also gained promotion to Division 1 North of Greater London Women's Football League after finishing 2nd in the Division 2 North.

Hilltop draws many of its players from the Somali community in London, and from time to time enters Somali tournaments around the world, having done so in Canada and Somalia. They also participate in the Somali British Champions league, of which they are the current holders. The team's success in recent seasons, and their exciting brand of football, has not gone unnoticed. Hilltop manager Abdullah Mohammed was recently appointed as the assistant coach of the Somali national team, and forward Ali Mohamed received a call-up to the senior Somalia side for the first time in 2021 as well.
