WE ARE THE WATERS



Virginia Water Football Club was formed during the 1919-1920 season, and celebrated its centenary in 2020. During the reign of King Edward VIII, Waters gained financial support (Royal Patronage) from the Crown, in the sum of £2 per annum. This continued throughout the reign of King George VI, who actually 'gifted' VWFC their current ground. Until 1964 Waters were part of the Woking & District League, at which time they joined the Surrey Intermediate League, moving on to the Spartan League soon after.

In 1969 the clubhouse at the Timbers was erected and opened by Sir Stanley Rouse, CBE, who was then President of FIFA. The Timbers was given this name after the late Harry Timbers, one of the founder members of our Club. In 1970 Waters gained promotion from the Spartan League to the Combined Counties League, and steady progress saw them gain entry into the FA Vase. The 1980's were a disappointing period in our history, that saw successive relegations to the Surrey South Eastern Combination Intermediate League. The 1990/91 season proved a turning point, with Waters winning the Surrey Intermediate Cup, beating Colney Hall 3-0 in the final. This was followed with promotion to the Surrey Premier League and Combined Counties League, but we were only allowed to stay there for one season due to league ground grading rulings.

Despite that relegation, Waters won three Surrey County Premier Cups in 1995, 1996 and 1997, the latter being part of a historic League and League Cup Treble! With league name changes the norm, in 2000 the Surrey Premier League became the Surrey Senior League, where Waters stayed until 2002, before joining the Surrey Intermediate League (Western), for three seasons before another relegation and immediate promotion. In 2010 Waters won promotion to the Surrey Elite League. Despite winning the County and League Cups, further promotion proved elusive.

Ceri Jones was appointed manager in 2015-16, finishing fourth in his first season in charge. The following season he appointed Richard Banks as Head Coach, and Waters duly won back-to-back promotions to the Hellenic League Division One, then Premier (competing at Step 5 for the first time in the club's history) - including a cup double in 2016-17. After a period of consolidation in the Hellenic Premier Division, there was to be another FA National League System adjustment, that saw Waters moved across to the Combined Counties Premier League (North).

At the end of the 2021-22 season, after 7 successful years as manager, Ceri became Director of Football, and appointed Adam Bessent as his successor along with Jake Bessent as Assistant Manager. The 2022/23 season saw us reach the Senior County Cup final, finishing second to Met Police in the final, and also our highest ever league position - a respectable 7th place. The Bessent's sadly resigned their positions early in to the 2023/24 season. An internal promotion saw Adam Sams take over the reins as the new First Team manager, ably assisted by Ben Warren as first team coach, and successfully lead the club to another 7th place League finish and reach the Combined Counties Premier League Cup Final where we were narrowly beaten by Burnham FC 2-1 to be Runner's Up. The club still aims for continued success, both on and off the pitch, in the future and the move, under a new Ground Share arrangement, to the great facilities at Slough Town is seen as a step forward for the 2024/25 Season.

Waters also have a youth section at the club (VWFC Youth), which the club proudly aspires to, and uses as a direct pathway to adult football. The Youth Section continues to flourish; it now stands at 19 teams and growing rapidly, especially our girls program, in partnership with the FA Wildcats scheme, which will see 4 Girls Teams (U9, U10, U11 and U13) play under the Waters Banner in the 2024/25 season.

TODAY'S OPPONENTS



History - The club were founded in 1939 and played in the Middlesex Senior League until joining the Coronitian League in the 1946–47 season. In 1948 they won the Middlesex Senior Cup. In 1963 the club transferred to Division One of the Athenian League. They finished third in their first season and were promoted to the Premier Division. In 1966–67 they finished bottom of the division and were relegated to Division One. This was followed by a second successive relegation to Division Two as they finished bottom of the table again.

In 1972 the club was renamed Edgware. When the Athenian League disbanded in 1984 they joined the London Spartan League before changing their name back to Edgware Town in 1987. They won the Premier Division of the Spartan League in 1987–88 and 1989–90, and after their second title win, were promoted to Division Two North of the Isthmian League After league re-organisation in 1991 they were placed in Division Three, which they won the following season. They were relegated back to Division Three in 2001. In 2006 the now-renamed Division Two was disbanded and Edgware were transferred to the Premier Division of the Spartan South Midlands League. They won it at the first attempt, also winning the Premier Cup and the Challenge Trophy. The club was promoted to Division One North of the Isthmian League but folded at the end of the 2007–08 season due to lack of funds.

In 2014 a group including Dan and Antony Manzi, Daz Bloor and Ken Batten secured the clubs inclusion back into non-league football. After a shaky start to the 2014-15 season, the wares finished a credible 9th and Middx Prem Cup Runners up after the management team of Michael Roche, Fabio Valenti and Peter Grant came in. The 2015-16 Season saw "The Wares" finish top with only 2 defeats and lose in the Divisional Cup Final to Crawley Green. The ground, Silver Jubilee Park has achieved a C grade rating with 3 new stands, new floodlights and extended changing rooms and a new perimeter fence. The Ken Batten Stand should be in place shortly and then SJP will have 2 seated stands, 3 standing covered stands with a capacity just shy of 2000. Fabio Valenti took over as 1th team manager in June 2016.

Fergus Moore took over the team in 2017 after the departure of Fabio Valenti, and after a difficult start the team finished 10ⁿ which showed a marked improvement from the season before. The 2018-19 season was another midtable finish with Fergus pretty much on his own but towards the end of the season he was joined by Joe Pascoe who came over from the Hendon U18's and that's how the 2019-20 season will begin. The 2019-20 season was cut short because of Covid19 but before that happened the Wares were looking pretty good for a top 10 finish in the league, having started the season well the team went through a horrible period losing 13 of their next 14 games before recovering to win 6 of their next 9 games. The 2020-21 season starts with the return of out title winning manager Michael Roche as Fergus's assistant and also arriving on the coaching staff are Scott McGleish, Glen Parry and Julian Darby. 2020-21 was again brutally cut short with the season being abandoned in December but not before there was a managerial change with Rak Hudson replacing Fergus Moore and having had only three competitive before lockdown 2021-22 means Rak can start afresh with a brand new squad

2021-22 Finally a complete season and our first in the newly formed Combined Counties Premier Division North, Rak assembled a brand-new squad and in their first competitive match were beaten 3-0 by Hadley in the FA Cup but in the league, they won 3 of their first 4 matches and drew the other to eventual runaway winners Hanworth Villa. The club finished a creditable 8th in the division and had a decent run in the League Cup where they reached the third round losing away at Cobham and but for a dreadful run at the end of the season they may have finished in the top 5. The 22-23 season saw the club change its name from Edgware Town to Edgware & Kingsbury to reflect the area where our home ground is situated.

The season itself saw the club finish 6th in the Combined Counties Premier Division North which was the highest finish since the club reformed. After a strong start the club went through a 9-game winless streak midway through the season but a few mid-season changes saw the club finish the season strongly. The club also reached the 1th Qualifying round of the FA Cup knocking out step 4 side AFC Dunstable after a replay. The 23-24 season promised a lot with the majority of the squad that finished the previous season remaining and things did start well, a replay defeat to Waltham Abbey in the FA Cup who only equalized in the 95th minute in the first game to send it to a replay, and a decent start in the league, the club did not foresee the horrible run that ensued that saw us avoid relegation by a single point, let's hope there is no repeat.
